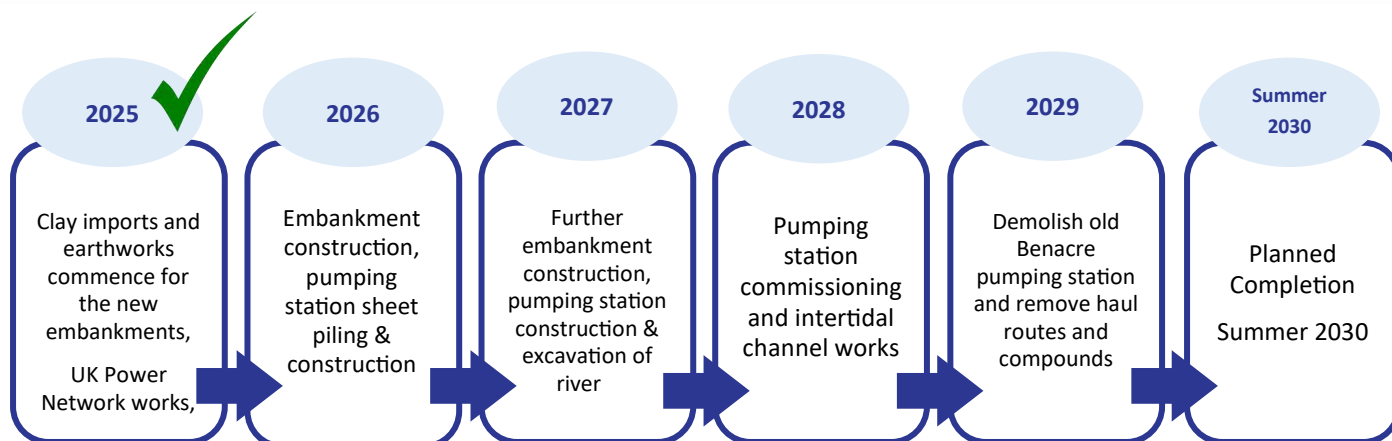

2025 Achievements:

- All ditch and river crossings are now installed.
- The haul route is fully established.
- Key ecological mitigation works are complete.
- First phase of UKPN trenching and power diversion works are finished.
- Trial trenches uncovered notable Roman archaeology, now being recorded and preserved.

2026 Plan:

- Complete clay import.
- Construction of flood embankments.
- Piling for Kessingland and Lothingland pumping stations.



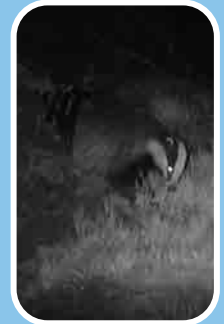
